Tractor and Machinery Safety Certification

The Tractor and Machinery Certification/Training program has been available for many years to 14/15 year old youth wishing to operate tractors and farm machinery for non-related parties (for hire). In addition, Wisconsin Law (Act 455) requires any child under the age of 16 (minimum 12 years of age) who operates a farm tractor or self-propelled implements of husbandry on the highway (public road) to be certified as having successfully completed a tractor and machinery operation safety training course. There are no family or relative exemptions. The course runs from June 19-21. Hours are 8am to 4pm in Sparta. Mrs. Dorn will provide transportation to and from Sparta - leaving school at 7:15 each day. Students will need to bring a bag lunch. See Mrs. Dorn for course registration materials.

AgriScience Independent Study 8-12 graders

Course Description: The Summer AgriScience Independent Study course is for students who are working, volunteering, or looking for additional leadership opportunities. There are two pathways for the Independent Study course:

Supervised Agricultural Experience Workdays - Includes any agriculture or natural resources related activities or projects. It can even be a job you are already getting paid for. Example activities include but ARE NOT limited to: working on a farm, raising an animal to show at the fair, working at a farmer's market, landscaping, mowing lawns, working at a park or nature center, repairing tractors, food prep at a restaurant, volunteering at an animal shelter, or anything plant, animal, environmental, or natural resources related is eligible. These workdays will be conducted in the classroom and will allow the agricultural instructor the opportunity to utilize classroom technology for students to work on SAE records.

AgriScience Fair Project - The purpose of this option is for students to conduct an AgriScience Fair project during summer school times. The students project will be submitted to participate at the State FFA Convention in June of 2018. The National FFA Agriscience Fair recognizes student researchers studying the application of agricultural scientific principles and emerging technologies in agricultural enterprises. The agriscience fair is for middle and high school students. Participation begins at the local level and progresses to state and national levels. Project categories include - animal systems, environmental services/natural resource systems, food products & processing systems, plant systems, power, structure, & technical systems, and social systems.
